<u>PETITION FOR APPROVAL OF GUARDIAN AD LITEM FEES</u> <u>AND ALLOCATION OF PAYMENT</u>

NOW COMES, the Guardian *ad Litem*, MICHAEL IAN BENDER, and pursuant to 750 ILCS 5/506(b), ask this Honorable Court for the following: (1) To approve his fees as reasonable and necessary; and (2) to enforce payment of said fees per the July 14, 2023 Order, stating the following in support:

- 1. On June 6, 2019, this Honorable Court appointed Michael Ian Bender as Guardian ad Litem in this matter. Pursuant to the June 6, 2019 Appointment Order, both parties were ordered to pay Michael Ian Bender \$500.00 each as and for a retainer. A true and correct copy of the June 6, 2019 Appointment Order is attached hereto as **Exhibit A.**
- 2. Michael Ian Bender, in said capacity, has diligently investigated and reported regarding the best interests of the minor children and related matters.
 - 3. Michael Ian Bender's reduced billing rate is \$375.00 per hour.
- 4. Michael Ian Bender's normal billing rate is \$500.00 per hour for out-of-court matters and \$700.00 per hour for in-court matters.
- 5. On November 16, 2021, this Honorable Court entered an order stating, in pertinent part, as follows:

- "1. The Guardian *ad litem*, Michael Bender's, fees for the period of September 4, 2019 through October 7, 2021 are necessary and reasonable.
- 2. The allocation of the Guardian *ad litem's* fees is a 50/50 split and shall continue to be a 50/50 split between the parties.
- 3. Petitioner, Peter Matt, owes Michael Bender \$89.00 for fees incurred through October 7, 2021. Peter Matt shall pay \$89.00 to Michael Bender on or before December 15, 2021.
- 4. Respondent, Megan Mason, owes Michael Bender \$4,629.75 for fees incurred through October 7, 2021. Megan Mason shall pay Michael Bender \$500 per month until the \$4,629.75 is paid in full. Said payments shall begin on December 15, 2021 and shall continue on the 15th of each month thereafter." A true and correct copy of the November 16, 2021 Order is attached hereto as **Exhibit B.**
- 6. On July 14, 2023, this Honorable Court reallocated the Guardian *ad Litem*'s fees as follows: "Megan Matt shall pay 60% and Peter Matt 40% of the GAL fees since the appointment of the GAL, and those going forward." A true and correct copy of the July 14, 2023 Order submitted for entry is attached hereto as **Exhibit C.**
- 7. Michael Ian Bender is owed \$19,667.43 in fees for the services rendered since his June 6, 2019 appointment through July 14, 2023. See billing statements incorporated by reference at **Exhibit D**.
- 8. The total amount of fees for the services rendered from June 6, 2019 to July 14, 2023 is \$44,610.75. Per the July 14, 2023 Order reallocating Michael Ian Bender's fees, at 40%, Peter Matt owed \$17,844.30, and at 60%, Megan Mason owed \$26,766.45.
- 9. Megan Mason has paid \$3,929.00 of the \$26,766.45, leaving a balance of \$22.837.45 owed to the Guardian *ad Litem*.
- 10. Peter Matt has paid Michael Ian Bender \$21,014.32 of which \$3,170.02 is the responsibility of Megan Mason. Megan Mason, accordingly, owes Peter Matt \$3,170.02.

- 11. Given that Peter Matt paid Michael Ian Bender \$3,170.02 towards Megan Mason's fees, Megan Mason owes Michael Ian Bender \$19,667.43 in fees for the services rendered from June 6, 2019 to July 14, 2023, and she owes Peter Matt \$3,170.02 for reimbursement of fees paid on her behalf to Michael Ian Bender.
- 12. Michael Ian Bender respectfully asks this Honorable Court to find that said services and billing were necessary and reasonable.
- 13. Michael Ian Bender also respectfully asks this Honorable Court to enter a Judgment in favor of Caesar & Bender, LLP and against Megan Mason in the amount of \$19,667.43. A true and correct copy of a proposed Judgment for entry is attached hereto as **Exhibit E.**
- 14. Megan Mason is gainfully employed and, therefore, the Guardian *ad Litem* asks this Honorable Court for leave to issue the "Citation to Discover Assets to Debtor's Employer" attached hereto as **Exhibit F**, as well as a return date for Megan Mason's employer to respond to the attached Citation to Discover Assets to Debtor's Employer.

WHEREFORE, the Guardian *ad Litem*, MICHAEL IAN BENDER, asks this Honorable Court to enter the following:

- (A) A finding that the fees and billing are necessary and reasonable;
- (B) A judgment against Megan Mason and in favor of Caesar & Bender, LLP in the amount of \$19,667.43;
- (C) Leave for Caesar & Bender, LLP to issue the attached Citation to Discover Assets to Debtor's Employer;
- (D) A return date for Megan Mason's employer to respond to the attached Citation to Discover Assets to Debtor's Employer;
 - (E) An order requiring Megan Mason to reimburse Peter Matt \$3,170.02; and

(F) An order for such other relief as this Honorable Court deems fit.

This cause coming before the Court for an in-person hearing on Peter Matt's Second Motion for Section 508(b) Attorney's Fees filed on June 4, 2022; Ruling on the amount of attorney's fees Megan Matt shall pay to Peter Matt pursuant to the Rule 137 sanctions per the Court's August 3, 2022 Order; Peter Matt's Petition for Rule to Show Cause filed on March 3, 2023; Peter Matt's Motion for Attorney's Fees Pursuant to 60/214(b)(13) filed on May 2, 2023; Megan Matt's Motion for Allocation of GAL Fees, Extraordinary Healthcare Costs, 604B Investigation Costs, and Attorney Fees for Megan Mason; Megan Matt's Section 2-401 Petition for Relief from Judgment in August 21, 2020 Ruling of Contempt of Court; Megan Matt's Motion to Vacate Plenary Order of Protection Entered in this Court Against Megan Mason on March 8, 2023, and the GAL's Petition for Rule to Show Cause, Peter Matt appearing in person with Counsel, Megan Matt appearing in person on her own behalf, the GAL being present via Zoom, and the Court being advised:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. Peter Matt's Second Motion for Section 508(b) Attorney's Fees filed on June 4, 2022 is granted. Megan Matt shall pay to Peter Matt the amount of \$5,407.50 as and for her obligation to pay Peter Matt's attorney's fees and costs following the finding of contempt on April 4, 2022. The obligation under this paragraph constitutes the kind of debt that is not dischargeable in bankruptcy pursuant to 11 U.S.C.A §523(a)(15). Megan Matt is therefore barred as to any defenses to the non-dischargeability of the payments required by this paragraph which she would otherwise be entitled to present in case of her voluntary or involuntary bankruptcy, including, but not limited to, discharge under Chapter 13, or any other chapter of the United States Bankruptcy Code.
- 2. Following the Court's ruling the amount of attorney's fees Megan Matt shall pay to Peter Matt pursuant to the Rule 137 sanctions per the Court's August 3, 2022 Order, Megan Matt shall pay to Peter Matt the amount of \$12,320.00 as and for Rule 137 sanctions. The obligation under this paragraph constitutes the kind of debt that is not dischargeable in bankruptcy pursuant to 11 U.S.C.A §523(a)(15). Megan Matt is therefore barred as to any defenses to the non-dischargeability of the payments required by this paragraph which she would otherwise be entitled to present in case of her voluntary or involuntary

- bankruptcy, including, but not limited to, discharge under Chapter 13, or any other chapter of the United States Bankruptcy Code.
- 3. Peter Matt's Petition for Rule to Show Cause filed on March 3, 2023 is granted. Megan Matt is found to be indirect civil contempt of court following the issuance of a Rule and her failure to comply with Article V, Paragraph F(2)(ii) of the Marital Settlement Agreement incorporated into the Judgment after failing to provide a legal sufficient reason for said failure. Megan Matt's testimony that she wrote the identified letters in the petition, as well as her testimony that she called the FBI twice, send two emails, and submitted other letters to seek Peter Matt's deportation is in part the basis that her failure is willful and contumacious. The Court's issuance of a purge is continued to the next court date.
- 4. Peter Matt's Motion for Attorney's Fees Pursuant to 60/214(b)(13) filed on May 2, 2023 is granted. Megan Matt shall pay to Peter Matt the amount of \$9,100.00 as and for 750 ILCS 60/214(b)(13). The obligation under this paragraph constitutes the kind of debt that is not dischargeable in bankruptcy pursuant to 11 U.S.C.A §523(a)(15). Megan Matt is therefore barred as to any defenses to the non-dischargeability of the payments required by this paragraph which she would otherwise be entitled to present in case of her voluntary or involuntary bankruptcy, including, but not limited to, discharge under Chapter 13, or any other chapter of the United States Bankruptcy Code.
- 5. Megan Matt's Motion for Allocation of GAL Fees, Extraordinary Healthcare Costs, 604B Investigation Costs, and Attorney Fees for Megan Mason is granted in part and denied in part.
 - a. Megan Matt is not awarded attorney's fees and that part of the motion is denied.
 - b. The allocation of healthcare costs as identified in the May 16, 2023 order shall stand, and that part of the motion is denied.
 - c. The re-allocation of GAL fees is granted and Megan Matt shall pay 60% and Peter Matt 40% of the GAL fees since the appointment of the GAL, and those going forward. The parties shall prepare calculations as to the amounts paid and owed by the next court date for the entry of an order identifying the amount of reimbursement owed from Megan Matt to Peter Matt.
 - d. The re-allocation of Section 604.10(b) fees is granted and Megan Matt shall pay 60% and Peter Matt 40% of the Section 604.10(b) fees since the appointment of both Section 604.10(b) experts and those going forward. The parties shall prepare calculations as to the amounts paid and owed by the next court date for the entry of an order identifying the amount of reimbursement owed from Megan Matt to Peter Matt.
- 6. Megan Matt's Section 2-401 Petition for Relief from Judgment in August 21, 2020 Ruling of Contempt of Court is denied.
- 7. Megan Matt's Motion to Vacate Plenary Order of Protection Entered in this Court Against Megan Mason on March 8, 2023 is denied.

- 8. The GAL has 28 days to amend his Petition for Rule to Show Cause and to file a fee petition consistent with the rulings herein.
- 9. This matter is set for status, order of purge, calculations as to GAL and Section 604.10(b) fees, payments from Megan Matt to Peter Matt and structure for same, and presentment of GAL motions on September 6, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. via Zoom.

- If you do not answer or come to the court date listed in section 2, the judge may do one of two things:
 - Issue a rule to show cause; OR
 - Enter a conditional judgment.

Notice to Employer

- If there is a rule to show cause court date, you will have to explain why you did not come to court on the court date and why you should not be found in contempt of court. If you do not come to the rule to show cause on the set court date, the judge may find you in contempt, and you might be arrested and jailed.
- If the court enters a conditional judgment, you will have 30 days to answer or appear. If you fail to do so, then the court may enter a final judgment against you.

3. The employer's duties and obligations:

- a. Fill out and return the *Answer* on page **4** on or before the court date listed on page **1**. The *Answer* asks basic questions about the debtor and their income.
- b. The first question in the *Answer* is whether the debtor is employed by you or works for you under some other contractual relationship.
 - If they do not, then check the "No" box, and send the form back.
 - ii. If the debtor does work for you, answer the rest of the *Answer* about pay periods, hourly wage, gross pay, and required deductions from gross pay. The *Answer* explains how to calculate the amount you need to withhold for the garnishment/turnover order.
 - iii. If a positive amount is listed on section **4M** on the *Answer*, withhold that amount until there is a court order to turn over the wages or the *Citation* is dismissed.
 - iv. If income varies, withholding must be recalculated for every pay period.
- c. Sign the form, file the original with the Circuit Clerk who issued the Citation, and keep a copy for yourself. Give or send a copy of the completed Answer to the debtor and to the creditor.
- d. Do not withhold any wages from the debtor if the debtor's income after taxes is equal to or less than 45 times (x) the federal or Illinois minimum wage, whichever is greater. Illinois minimum wage will increase between January 1, 2020 and January 1, 2025. See the Exempt Wages Table on the last page of this form to determine what wages are exempt based on the current minimum wage. If the debtor's wages after taxes are more than this exemption, then you should withhold either (1) 15% of the debtor's gross income or (2) the debtor's income after taxes minus the exemption, whichever is less. See how to calculate the amount in the Answer.

Do not turn over any funds until you receive a wage deduction/turnover order.
